Annual Memorial

**Grigoris Afxentiou &
Evagoras Pallikarides**

This month we celebrated the memorial of Grigoris Afxentiou and Evagoras Pallikarides. Both heroes who died for the freedom of their country. Grigoris Afxentiou was second in command of EOKA and led many campaigns against the British colonial government. He ultimately sacrificed himself for the freedom of his country, famously saying 'Μόλων Λαβέ' 'Come and get me' when surrounded and asked to surrender. Evagoras Pallikarides was a revolutionary who was also a member of EOKA between 1955-59. His bravery and thirst for freedom led him away from school and eventually led to his death. He was the youngest person to be hanged, but also the last. He is remembered for saying 'I know you will sentence me to death but whatever I did, I did as a Greek Cypriot who wants his liberty.' We remember the brave soldiers with sadness but most of all we remember them with great pride.

It is a great honor for our school to once again enjoy the utmost joy of representing Cyprus as a school of diaspora in such a special ceremony attended by prominent figures, including Her Majesty Queen Camilla, the Prince of Wales, William, and other members of the British royal family, Prince Edward, Earl of Wessex, with his wife Sophie, Countess of Wessex, and Princess Anne.

The involvement of Agia Triada school, and particularly Dr. Tryfonos, in Commonwealth programs concerning youth, remains one of our main objectives every new school year, aiming for our students to understand the value of the Commonwealth as a multicultural organization encompassing peoples with different cultures, including Cyprus.

On Saturday, March 16th, we had our annual celebration for the Greek Independence Day which is celebrated across Greece, Cyprus and the Greek diaspora centres on 25th of March.

All our classes, from nursery/reception to GCSE, performed and the children did an amazing job honouring our nation's history. The children read poems praising the heroes of the Greek Revolution and the importance of freedom.

Our pupils danced traditional Greek dances and at the end of the celebration sang Greek songs and of course, the Greek National Anthem.

Alongside this double celebration of the 25th of March, our school honoured the Ethniki Organosi Kypriou Agoniston (EOKA), which was founded on April 1st 1955. EOKA aimed to fight for Cyprus' independence against the British colonies and its union with Greece. On April 1, Cyprus commemorates the start of the insurgence against the British in 1955.

Greek Independence Day


25th March



The Greek Revolution of 1821 was a big moment in Greek history when the Greek people fought to break free from the rule of the Ottoman Empire, which had controlled them for centuries. This wasn't just about fighting - it was also about Greeks coming together to reclaim their language, culture, and identity. It showed that when people unite for a common cause, they can overcome even the toughest challenges.




The Filiki Eteria, also known as the Society of Friends, was a secret organization founded in 1814 with the aim of liberating Greece from Ottoman rule. It played a significant role in laying the groundwork for the Greek Revolution of 1821. The Filiki Eteria was founded by three Greek merchants: Nikolaos Skoufas, Emmanuel Xanthos, and Athanasios Tsakalof.



The heroes and heroines of the Greek War of Independence are immortalized not only for their valour on the battlefield but also for their unwavering commitment to the ideals of freedom and justice.

Among them stand iconic figures such as Alexandros Ypsilantis, Andreas Miaoulis, Manto Mavroyenous and Theodoros Kolokotronis, whose strategic brilliance and fearless leadership inspired countless others to join the fight for independence. Laskarina Bouvoulina, a legendary naval commander, symbolizes the indomitable spirit of the Greek people, leading her fleet against the Ottoman forces with unmatched courage and determination. Athanasios Diakos, revered as a martyr of the revolution, embodies the selflessness and sacrifice of those who laid down their lives in the pursuit of liberty.

THE COLOURS OF THE FLAG ARE BLUE AND WHITE



The Greek Flag has blue and white colours and nine blue and white stripes. These stripes represent the syllables of the phrase: Eleutheria i Thanatos- which means Freedom or Death- which dates back to the Greek Revolution
